DOCTOR OF NURSING PRACTICE - FAMILY NURSE PRACTITIONER FNP (ONLINE AND ONE ON-SITE BOOTCAMP)

This (BSN entry) 71-semester hour specialty track in the DNP program prepares licensed registered nurses with a BSN as family nurse practitioners (FNP) at the doctoral level. The goal of the program is to prepare graduates for advanced practice nursing with individuals and families throughout the lifespan and across the health continuum. Students complete a total of 1000 hours of clinical in various population-focused and/or specialty areas supervised by qualified preceptors. A DNP project must be completed to fulfill degree requirements. Upon completion of the program, graduates are eligible to write the FNP specialty certification examination administered by the American Nurses credentialing Center (ANCC) or the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners (AANP).

Admissions

- Applicants must have a BSN degree from a CNEA, ACEN, or CCNE accredited nursing program.
- 2. Proof of a current unencumbered nursing license.
- 3. A nursing grade point average of 3.0 based on a 4.0 scale.
