The interdisciplinary minor in entrepreneurship and innovation guides students to dream, design, and develop their innovative ideas into opportunities. The 21st century problem solving skills developed within the SEI minor are required for successful entrepreneurial endeavors and are in demand by large corporations, small businesses, family businesses, startups, nonprofit entities and social ventures. With the minor, students will engage in experiential learning and have the opportunity to develop competencies, including:

- · Dreaming new ideas into realistic opportunities
- · Harnessing resources to design for success
- · Overcoming challenges to advance ideas
- Assessing possibilities to solve business, societal, and environmental problems
- · Commercializing products and services
- · Networking with diverse groups
- · Showcasing innovative thoughts

The 15-hour minor includes required courses are outlined below. Students must have at least 12 hours in courses that are unique from those used to fulfill their major requirements.
