The middle school education program prepares you for the State of Illinois Professional Educator's License (PEL) in Middle School Education, which qualifies you to teach children from fifth grade through eighth grade. It also includes an English as a Second Language endorsement that licenses you to teach English language learners.

For Social Studies a student can earn either a Bachelor in Science degree (120 hours) or Bachelor in Arts degree (121 hours).
